

WHAT CAN I LEAVE MY FAVOURITE CHARITY OR CAUSE

Types of legacy

- **Residuary:** the remainder, or a portion of the remainder, of your estate after payment of all liabilities and expenses and any legacies you have given
- **Pecuniary:** a specific sum of money
- **Specific:** a particular asset or specific goods
- **Contingent bequest:** a gift should a particular event occur

Types of gift

Anything from a specific amount of money, to business shares, to jewellery, to a house – all of which pass on excellent **tax advantages** to the charity receiving it and create a fitting legacy. Many people choose to leave something to their favourite cause or charity when they die as a sign of their appreciation, and legacies provide significant much-needed income to many charities. If you do choose to make a gift to a UK registered charity, any donation will be free from Inheritance Tax.

It is important to ensure that your Will contains specific wording if you intend to leave a gift to charity.
