Key purpose of volunteer role

To assist and work alongside the Wellbeing Team to deliver conservation volunteering and wellbeing at Bath City Farm. To support beneficiaries with long term health conditions and common mental health problems to engage in nature based activities and wellbeing interventions. To gain a broader understanding and experience of key aspects of Nature, Health and Wellbeing and Green Care services.

Areas of volunteer activity

Tasks may include any or all of the following:

- Encouraging participants to engage in practical conservation activities which could include hedge laying, pond maintenance, meadow improvement, seed collection and propagation, wildlife ID walks and surveying.
- Encouraging participants to engage in wellbeing interventions by taking part yourself and help initiate conversations.
- Taking a lead to deliver conservation activities to enable the wellbeing team to conduct 1-2-1 meetings, collect monitoring and evaluation data.
- Supporting the wellbeing team to set up and pack away activities throughout the day.
- Assisting with loading/unloading of tools and materials ensuring tools and equipment are stored away safely and in good working order.
- Advocating the value of nature and its benefits for wellbeing.
- Potential to be facilitator trained to lead nature-based and wellbeing interventions.

Desirable attributes and skills

- Enthusiasm and willingness to learn and develop skills in nature and wellbeing
- An enthusiasm for conservation and wildlife
- An enjoyment of working outdoors in variable weather conditions
- Confident yet diplomatic person who is able to work with a range of different people from different backgrounds and competencies
- Have some experience facilitating activities
- Excellent communication and time management skills
- Able to work as part of a team and follow instructions
- An interest in Avon Wildlife Trust and its values
