## **Overall purpose of job:**

To support nature's recovery through the conservation and restoration of habitats in the Pollinator Pathways project area, on Avon Wildlife Trust's (AWT) nature reserves and the wider landscape.

Engage local communities and landowners in nature recovery projects.

### Main responsibilities:

- To deliver AWTs Pollinator Pathways project, providing habitat creation and enhancement advice to farmers, landowners and communities within the project area
- Supporting AWT's goals for landscape-scale species and habitat restoration projects, by working with colleagues, partners, and landowners to improve connectivity and provide long-term ecological resilience across priority landscapes.
- Providing habitat creation & enhancement advice to farmers/landowners and community groups.
- Supporting habitat improvements on Nature Reserves within the project area.
- Conducting ecological surveys to guide land management advice and decisions.
- Administer a small existing capital works funding pot to enable habitat works to take place. Offering advice on other funding opportunities.
- Working with contractors to targets and reporting progress related to works completed and engagements.
- Ensure the highest levels of competence and health and safety of all staff, placements, contractors, and volunteers involved in land management.
- Supporting the promotion of wider conservation issues and AWT by working with the communications team, and assisting with AWT events for members and local communities.
- Supporting the development of similar future projects and funding bids.

## Management and supervision

- To supervise and direct the work of contractors and practical volunteers.
- Responsible for the health and safety of those working on AWT sites or work days on Pollinator Pathways sites.

## Accountability and resources

• Management of agreed elements of budgets for projects and site management.

### Job impact

- To make a significant contribution to AWT's strategic goal of creating 1000ha of new habitat by 2030.
- Providing restoration and management advice to farmers, landowners and communities within the Pollinator Pathways project area and supporting habitat improvements on AWT reserves.

## Independence and judgement

• Ability to exercise judgement in a variety of work activities, often working independently, either alone or supervising volunteers.

### **People and contacts**

- Frequent liaison with a range of stakeholders internally and externally including landowners and community groups.
- Ability to speak to groups of people to convey complex and sometimes controversial messages, and often acting as an advocate for the Trust.

### **Creativity and innovation**

• Work to agreed plans and targets. Ability to react and respond to unexpected nonroutine situations and opportunity to influence and input creatively to the development of wildlife conservation work, including expansion of the project.

### Working conditions

- Most delivery work will be outside, at AWT sites and other green spaces. Other work carried out from our central Bristol office, with options for some home working.
- Travel to meetings and sites as required.
- You may also be required to work from other AWT hubs and at a range of locations around the West of England area.
- Occasional evening and weekend work as necessary (TOIL awarded)
- Optional home working by prior agreement with your line manager
