# Overall purpose of job

Develop and manage Avon Wildlife Trust's (the Trust) Learning & Youth programmes, providing inspiring and inclusive opportunities for children and young people to connect with and learn about nature, and actively support nature's recovery.

#### Main responsibilities

- Develop and maintain a thriving programme for children and young people at our sites and in the community, including planning and resourcing, budgeting, reporting, monitoring and evaluation.
- Manage the Trust's <u>Folly Farm learning programme</u> training and supporting tutors to provide inspiring, inclusive and safe residential and day visits for schools, liaising with visiting schools and the Folly Farm Centre team, and evaluating and improving programmes.
- Manage and develop our inclusive youth programme to ensure positive outcomes
  for young people from under-served communities in our region supporting
  Youth Officers to plan and deliver a wide range of activities for ages 14-25, and
  leading the development of <u>Green Shoots</u>, our youth–led nature reserve alongside
  colleagues and partners.
- Support delivery of learning sessions at Folly Farm, Grow Wilder and other settings when required.
- Develop opportunities to extend the impact of our work with children & young people, including contributing to funding applications, working with colleagues across the Trust, partners and potential funders.

## **Management and Supervision**

- Recruitment and management and training of a team of learning delivery staff and youth officers, including seasonal tutors
- Recruitment, management and supervision of external tutors, contractors and volunteers.

#### **Accountability and Resources**

- Direct responsibility for the development and delivery of the Trust's Learning and Youth programmes, including project management, planning, reporting, and evaluation.
- Working with the Development Team and the Head of Communities &
   Engagement secures and maintains funding streams e.g. grants, contracts and
   partnership work to support programmes, including earned income from
   learning centres. Plans, controls and monitors project budgets, equipment and
   resources within designated departmental budgets.
- Responsible for implementing health & safety & safeguarding protocols for the Learning and Youth programmes.

- External impact through the provision of a programme designed to inspire and enable children and young people to connect with, learn about and take action for nature
- Ensures that the Trust achieves and maintains its reputation and credibility as an engaging, safe & innovative provider of nature-based learning in the West of England
- Advocates for young people, ensuring meaningful and inclusive opportunities are created across the Trust that enable young people to develop leadership skills and influence decisions
- Identifies and develops new opportunities for the Trust's Learning and Youth programmes, increasing the impact of our work and contributing to the achievement of our vision.
- Prioritises equality, diversity & inclusion and actively focuses on diversifying programmes by creating partnerships and opportunities for and with underserved children and young people.
